



### **SPORTS PREMIUM AND IMPACT REPORT – April 2018 – April 2019**

Sport Premium is an amount of money which the government has agreed to allocate to schools to increase the quality & breadth of PE & Sport provision, and increase participation in PE & Sport. The funding amount received by schools is based upon the number of children of primary age at the school. At Nineland's Primary, the PE Subject Leader, in discussions with the SLT and also the governor responsible for monitoring the expenditure of the Sports Premium, has the responsibility for developing PE and sport in school and also deciding upon the effective use of Sport Premium Funding. We strive to promote healthy and active lifestyles and aim to provide sporting opportunities for all our pupils. Therefore we welcome the additional funding, which will further enhance our provision and provide additional opportunities for increased participation. We are very proud to have been awarded the Silver Award of the School Games Mark in July 2018.

The April 2018-April 2019 Sport Premium funding for our school was received in two separate payments.

## PE and Sports Funding: Impact Report 2017/2018

From DfE the guidance, Ninelands chose to prioritise the funding in 2017/2018 under the following headings:

- provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively;
- increase the number of sporting competitions;
- continue to develop range of extra-curricular provision.

### 1. Impact on Extra-curricular sports clubs:

#### *Sports Clubs attendance 2017/18*

In 2017/18 Ninelands offered 6 extra-curricular sports clubs across the year. There was a greater uptake in the number of children in Y3 and Y4 to attend football club, therefore a separate club was offered to enable more children to access these clubs. The numbers of children attending the extra-curricular clubs also increased from the previous academic year.

#### *Sports Clubs attendance 2017/18*

In 2017/18 Ninelands offered 7 extra-curricular sports clubs across the year. During this academic year, coaches were employed to deliver two after-school clubs twice per week on top of the existing goodwill of teaching staff to run clubs. This enabled an increase in the number of extra-curricular clubs offered to our KS2 children. As with the previous year, there was a greater uptake in the number of children in Y3 and Y4 wishing to attend the football club, therefore a separate club was offered to enable more children to access these clubs. The numbers of children attending the extra-curricular clubs also increased from the previous academic year.

## 2. Impact of providing PE coaching and CPD training for staff:

## 3. Impact on Sports competitions participation 2017/18

#### City and National Representation/Honours

In 2017/18, Ninelands had two children representing the school whilst playing football in the Under 11 age group for Leeds City Boys. Also, a Y6 girl competed in the National Cross-Country running championships after qualifying through local, city and regional finals for the second year in a row.

#### Alistair Brownlee visit and Triathlon Challenge Sponsorship

In June 2018 Olympic triathlete Alistair Brownlee visited Ninelands as part of the prize for winning a whole school scootathlon event. He spent time with Year 6, hosting a question and answer session, before joining Year 1 – Year 5 on the school field to encourage the children during their scootathlon challenge. The total raised from the triathlon challenge was a tremendous £2404.92. In total, the children who took part from across school in the challenge swam 120.6km, biked/scooted 651km and also ran 194km. This means that we are half way to funding our outdoor gym equipment. There will be another sporting sponsorship event later this academic year to help us try and raise the rest of the money but more importantly to further our work around promoting the benefits physical activity both in and out of school.

### **How Ninelands will sustain the impact made from the funding**

In 2018/19 we intend to spend the PE and School Sport Premium funding to meet the following objectives:

\*Invest in whole school training in the Real PE scheme to assist staff in increasing their subject knowledge and support in delivering high quality PE lessons for all children.

\*Continue to develop staff CPD through our link with our well-established link with the coach from *Premier Coaching Ltd*

These objectives will form the body of the 2018/19 PE and School Sport Action Plan.
